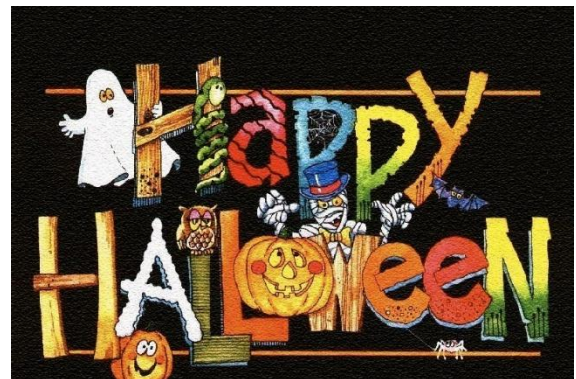

- #1 **Franklin County ADAMH - Proposed Tax Levy (Renewal and Increase)** - Operation of mental health, alcohol and drug addiction programs for children, adults and families, including residential and outpatient treatment programs, school and community-based prevention programs and patient housing. Renew 2.85 mills, increase 0.5 mills, Total 3.35 mills, \$74 for each \$100,000 of the county auditor's appraised value, 10 years, commencing in 2026.
- #2 **Franklin County - Proposed Tax Levy (Renewal)** - Provision and maintenance of zoological park service and facilities. 0.75 mill, \$13 for each \$100,000 of the county auditor's appraised value, 10 years, commencing in 2025.

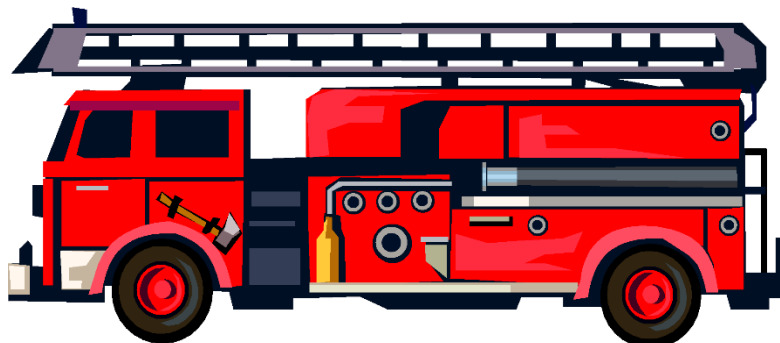


2025 Fire Prevention Week: October 5-11

There is so much everyone can do for clean water here in Franklin County. We would like all communities and groups to encourage each other during the week of October 1-7, 2025, to take a moment at home or at work and get involved to make Franklin County and Central Ohio a great place to live, work, and play.

Franklin County has over 2,940 miles of waterways including ditches, streams, and rivers (that's longer than distance from L.A. to New York!) that drain the county throughout several watersheds, ultimately dumping into the Ohio River. Stormwater is generated from rain and snowmelt that flow over land or hard surfaces, picking up pollutants such as trash, chemicals, oils, and dirt. Some common household items including lawn fertilizer, pet waste and paint can easily wash away too, carried directly to our surface water by storm drains. During Stormwater Awareness Week, Franklin Soil and Water Conservation District urges residents to take one or more of the following actions to help make sure that clean streams start right here in Franklin County:

- Take the Stormwater Awareness Pledge to be entered into a drawing for a rain barrel!
- Organize a Community or Neighborhood Clean-Up.
- **Plant Native Trees & Plants.**
- Adopt a storm drain! **Keep your drain clear of debris like leaves and litter.**
- **Build a rain garden in your yard or do some weeding and freshening up of one in your neighborhood.**
- **Mulch leaves on your grass to help soil conditions.**
- Ask a local business to become a **Water Quality Partner.**
- Properly dispose of chemicals and **hazardous waste** that's no longer being used.
- **Fix car leaks to protect water quality.**
- Always pick up and throw away your **pet's waste.**
- Reduce winter salt usage.
- Share Newsletter Articles & Social Media Posts on your channels.



Anyone can participate in Stormwater Awareness Week (municipalities, townships, schools, watershed groups, or just you, individually!). The goal of Stormwater Awareness Week is to teach all residents and businesses that any pollution they leave on roadways, sidewalks, driveways, and parking lots, drain directly to our rivers and streams. Simple actions can improve water quality and reduce stormwater runoff.

Safely Dispose of Prescriptions and Medicines
Take Back Day: Saturday, October 25, 2025
10:00 am - 2:00 pm

When done with prescription medicine, it's easy to forget about it sitting unused in a drawer or medicine cabinet. But keeping unneeded medicine in the house can harm children, pets, teens, and adults if accidentally ingested or misused.

Properly disposing of medication also contributes to keeping our waterways and environment protected and healthy.

The best option for safely disposing of prescription medicines is at a prescription drug and medicine drop-off site. Thankfully, there are dozens of these locations throughout Franklin County that are available year-round.

Each site accepts dry prescription pills with no questions asked. If you have other items, such as liquid medicines, inhalers, needles, creams or patches, please call first to verify they will be accepted.

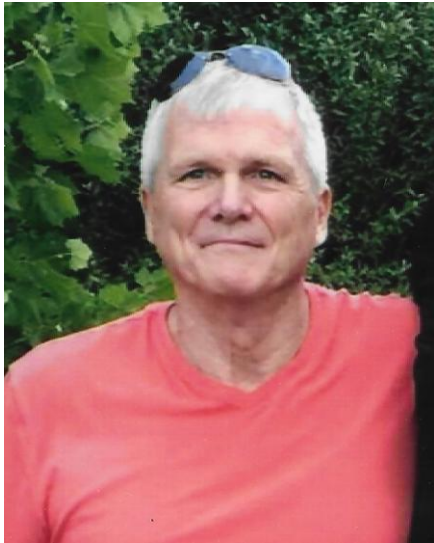

PROUD TREE OWNER

*Weeping Willow Tree Believed
Record By Lockbourne Owner*



PROUD TREE OWNER—Mrs. Louis Woods of Commerce-st in Lockbourne, poses before her giant weeping willow tree. Only 23 years old, it is believed to be a record tree. Mrs. Woods planted it in 1934 from a small sprig that she had ordered from a mail order house. The tree now measures more than eight feet around the trunk and is estimated to be about 90 feet tall. Shaped in almost a perfect circle, the outer branches form curtains around a massive inner chamber about 60 feet across.
