- #1 **Franklin County ADAMH - Proposed Tax Levy (Renewal and Increase)** - Operation of mental health, alcohol and drug addiction programs for children, adults and families, including residential and outpatient treatment programs, school and community-based prevention programs and patient housing. Renew 2.85 mills, increase 0.5 mills, Total 3.35 mills, \$74 for each \$100,000 of the county auditor's appraised value, 10 years, commencing in 2026.

- #2 **Franklin County - Proposed Tax Levy (Renewal)** - Provision and maintenance of zoological park service and facilities. 0.75 mill, \$13 for each \$100,000 of the county auditor's appraised value, 10 years, commencing in 2025.



WHO AM I

In this case, I will be building a pollinator garden in Lockbourne!

THE PROJECT

The garden will be built at the main entrance to Lockbourne's local park (where the Veteran Memorial used to be). 

Schedule an Annual Inspection: Have your propane heating system inspected by a professional each year to identify potential issues before they become costly repairs.


